Unfortunately, summer is also when students forget many of their important math and reading skills that they learned throughout the year. This "summer slide" causes teachers to spend valuable time re-teaching students those lost skills and it reduces the amount of time available to master new subjects and skills. As parents, you can help stop the summer slide by engaging in daily learning (and fun!) activities that help keep your child learning all summer long.

## Make It A Smarter Summer!

- ✓ **Learn through travel.** Research the destination WITH your child. Create a PowerPoint that can be shown to friends about where you will be visiting. Have you child keep a journal during the trip or write postcards from your journeys.
- ✓ **Learn through science.** Conduct wacky science experiments (Janice Cleave's '200 Goey, Slippery, Slimy, Weird and Fun Experiments). Explore your backyard, use plant and animal guidebooks and keep a record of the nature in notebook. Draw a map of your yard and create a key to the critters and plants that
